MOSESETJANE: Life will never be the same for the physically challenged Mr Max Molomo, a resident of Mosesetjane in Ga-Kgobudi who was given the gift of mobility today by the Mogalakwena Local Municipality Mayor Cllr Malesela Frans Mokwele who was accompanied by Speaker Pheladi Olifant, Chief Whip Cllr Staff Tsebe and other councillors.

Mayor Mokwele started his day by visiting Mokopane Comprehensive Primary School along the N11, just of whistle blow from the CBD. The school has been without electricity since January 2021 after the electricity transformer was stolen apparently by thugs.

Mayor Mokwele immediately requested Electrical Services Acting Manager Enoch Manamela to make sure that electricity is restored back to the school on Monday when school reopens. He further advised Mr Manamela to request approval from the Municipal Manager to work during the weekend so on Monday electricity is restored.

As the Mayor I have many important tasks, but there is one task that I take to heart the most, I want everyone who lives in our municipality to feel at home. They need to feel that they belong here. People need to feel that they have the freedom to access all areas of the municipality," said Mayor Mokwele.

"I believe that extra care should be taken when dealing with physically challenged individuals to give them a sense of belonging. We know that people with disabilities face serious challenges to participate meaningfully in community activities with regard to access to public institutions and facilities as well as unemployment," continued Mayor Mokwele.

"I want to say thank you Mayor and the collective, I would now be able to move around without any trouble with my electronic mobile, I will take a break from excising and cruise with my DSG. We are seven in number here at home and I want to assure every one of you here that come elections day, the African National Congress has seven votes. Thank you so much for this," said Mr Molomo.
