1. Mpyapedi Makgora – 91.9% (Waterberg High School) – District Champion
2. Dipela Mmankabi – 90.7% (Sephuti High School)
3. Mmolwa Neo – 89% (Hoërskool Piet Potgieter)
4. Mpho Mosheou – 88.1% (Seritarita Secondary School)

Each of the top four learners received R10 000 in cash, along with additional gifts, in recognition of their outstanding performance and dedication.

The Mogalakwena Local Municipality Mayor, Cllr Ngoako Taueatsoala, encouraged learners to use education as a tool for transformation and economic participation.
