3. Award for In-House Asset Register Preparation: In appreciation of the municipality's efforts in preparing its asset register in-house.

4. Award for 100% Spending of Regional Bulk Infrastructure Grant: For 100% spending of the Regional Bulk Infrastructure grant.

5. Award for 100% Spending of Water

Services Infrastructure Grant: For 100% spending of the Water Services Infrastructure grant.

## **MEC HANDS OVER REFURBISHED SCHOOL**



















MOKOPANE: As part of the Back to School Campaign, the MEC for Limpopo Department of Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure, Ernest Rachoene, officially handed over the newly refurbished Matsibe Secondary School in Mmalepetleke village.

The school, which achieved an impressive 85.1% pass rate in the 2024 academic year, had been facing significant infrastructure challenges since 1989, including

inadequate classrooms, ablution facilities and fencing.

MEC Rachoene emphasized the department's commitment to delivering quality infrastructure, stating, "Today, we have changed the lives of learners by providing an improved learning environment. We are proud to have brought smiles to the faces of pupils and communities alike.

"The refurbished school includes

two blocks comprising classrooms, ablution facilities, a water treatment plant and an administration block with various amenities.

Matsibe Secondary School is one of 25 schools in the province that have been completed by the Department of Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure in the current financial year, in collaboration with the Department of Basic Education.

## ATTEMPTED CABLE THEFT FOILED, SUSPECTS APPREHENDED





**MOKOPANE:** A daring attempt to steal electrical cables at our industrial site was thwarted thanks to swift action by the South African Police Service (SAPS).

The suspects were apprehended and taken to the police station, where a

case was opened.

The targeted electrical cables are valued at approximately R6 million. Two suspects from Mahwelereng Ext 17 are currently in custody.

We condemn the scourge of cable theft, which poses significant risks to public safety, disrupts essential services and incurs substantial economic losses.

The municipality commends the swift response of our security team, municipal officials and the SAPS in bringing the perpetrators to justice.

## **MUNICIPALITY HOST A SUCCESSFUL IDP REPRESENTATIVE FORUM**







MOKOPANE: The Mogalakwena Local Municipality recently held Integrated Development Plan (IDP) Representative Forum for the 2024/2025 financial year.

The event, attended by various stakeholders, aimed to share service delivery information and gather input from the community.

Mayor Ngoako Taueatsoala emphasized the significance of the forum, stating: "The municipality will, amongst other key information to share, include financial expenditure reports, the state of water and sanitation in the municipality, ward service delivery needs, institutional performance reports and reports from various government departments.

We are also aware of the heavy rainfall that we experienced this season,

which resulted in almost every area being declared a disaster zone, and the municipality is responding to those affected areas. "Key discussions centered around community-based planning, water provision, roads, and stormwater management.

Lepelle Northern Water, a key stakeholder, highlighted the devastating impact of recent flash floods on their systems, resulting in high iron manganese levels in the Doorndraai dam.

Stakeholders urged the municipality to address pressing concerns, including:-Tariff hikes: Ensure sufficient consultation with the community-Infrastructure repairs: Fix potholes and repair the bridge between Grasvlei and Raslet- Disaster response: Provide support to areas declared disaster zones due to heavy rainfallThe

municipality acknowledged the inputs and encouraged community structures to work closely with their respective councilors.

Mayor Taueatsoala concluded by emphasizing the need for collective effort in addressing infrastructure backlogs and promoting community cleanliness:"The heavy rainfall indeed affected our infrastructure to a deteriorating state.

We should work together and direct our energy towards addressing the backlog of all projects. Let's work together in cleaning our surroundings and attend the IDP Budget and Roadshow. "The forum demonstrated the municipality's commitment to transparency, accountability, and community engagement.

# LIMPOPO GOVERNMENT STEPS UP TO SUPPORT FLOOD AFFECTED AREAS

**BAKENBERG:** In a show of commitment to supporting affected communities, Limpopo MEC for Treasury, Hon. Kgabo Mahoai, recently visited the Mogalakwena Local Municipality to assess the damage caused by the recent floods.

He was accompanied by Mogalakwena Local Municipality Mayor, His Worship Cllr Ngoako Taueatsoala, officials from the Waterberg District Disaster Management, and other dignitaries.

The visit was part of the provincial council's efforts, led by Limpopo Premier Hon. Phophi Ramathuba, to provide aid to flood-stricken areas.

During his visit, Hon. Mahoai was briefed by local officials on the extent of the damage and visited affected areas, including Malepetleke village, where municipal officials were repairing a taxi road and other external streets.

The delegates also visited Mamatlakala village to evaluate the municipality's intervention efforts for affected families.

Their last stop was at Kgalakwena village, where a severely damaged road and bridge on the D192 road had disconnected vital routes between villages.

MEC Mahoai emphasized the urgency of repairing the damaged bridge, citing the lack of alternative routes. "It really needs urgent intervention. It's the main route that connects the villages, including Marken and Lephalale," he said.

The MEC interacted with community members, who expressed understanding of the disaster's magnitude, particularly regarding road infrastructure.











## **MUNICIPALITY EMBARKED ON METER**

## **AUDIT IN MAHWELERENG**



**MOKOPANE:** Mogalakwena Local Municipality conducted a meter audit in Mahwelereng, which began on February, 2025.

The municipal officials will be visiting households to conduct meter audits.

The importance of Meter reading is to ensures that residents are billed accurately for the water and other municipal services they consume, preventing over or undercharging by relying on estimated usage and allows you to monitor your energy consumption to identify potential areas for efficiency improvements and manage your bills effectively.

The municipality is urging residents to cooperate and grant officials access to their premises. Unfortunately, some residents are deliberately denying access and even threatening officials distributing notices.

The municipality stresses that cooperation is essential and failure to comply may result in the cut-off of other services. Notably, the majority of

complaints about service delivery come from Mahwelereng, where residents are not paying for services they consume.

The municipality has observed that parts of Mahwelereng Zone 1, 2 and Home 2000 have self converted into business zones, despite being designated as residential areas.

Many residents have constructed backrooms that are being utilized by students from the TVET college, miners and other different professionals working in town and Mahwelereng.

Additionally, numerous car washes and tuckshops are operating without licenses in the area.

These businesses consume municipal services, including water, refuse removal and others without paying for them.

The municipality has invested in the infrastructure development in the area, including paving 24 streets, bush clearing, water links, pipe burst and



unlocking main holes.

The municipality request that residents refrain from erecting tents on the roads as they causes potholes and comply with residential zoning regulations.

We also urge businesses operating in the area to obtain the necessary licenses and pay for municipal services.

The municipality is seeking cooperation from all areas to resolve these issues.

The municipality will also be embarking on a program of switching from conventional meters to prepaid meters.

All small businesses and residentials (households) will be compelled to be on prepaid meters.

The municipality is pleading with the consumers to pay for basic services to enable the municipality to provide basic and constant services

# MUNICIPALITY SHOWCASE ITS PROJECTS IN CELEBRATING 30 YEARS OF DEMOCRACY

MOKOPANE: The Mogalakwena Local Municipality, under the leadership of Mayor, Cllr Ngoako Taueatsoala embarked on a significant journey to celebrate 30 years of democracy in South Africa.

"During the tour, the Mayor and his team identified hotspot areas requiring urgent attention and showcased ongoing municipal projects including:- Ga-Malapile Water Scheme- Kromkloof Water Scheme-



The WDM Executive Mayor Cllr Maeko said, "The District Development Model (DDM) is a service delivery planning instrument to narrow the distance between citizens and government with the aim of delivering integrated services.

The DDM is aimed at responding and addressing challenges by bringing all spheres of government closer to the people with the view to foster an integrated approach to governance hence all government and sector departments gathered here."

"This is a method by which all three spheres of government and state entities work in unison in an impact-oriented way, where there is higher performance and accountability for coherent and effective service delivery and development outcomes. Skills development and empowering of local businesses are the most critical building blocks considered by government. That is where our mining houses should step in," added Maeko.
